1. Motion to pass Senate Meeting #9 minutes. Motion passes, 17-0-0.

Reports

- 1. Katharine T. Cobb | VP of Administration and Finance
 - Shamus Mott | Campus Facilities Planning, Design & Construction.
 - a. Katherine: As all of you are probably aware, we have a new student center that will open for spring semester. This has been a project that has been in progress and planning since the resolution has passed funding the center in 2010. There were many efforts to acquire space in the neighborhood. Challenging neighborhood to get space in, but we finally found space and the post office office agreed to let us rent a space directly across the vertical campus. We have a donor as well. Alan G. and Mary Anderson student center. 1000 square meters lobby on the 24th street entrance and underground space around 5000 square space. Shamus has been working on campus facilities, working on furniture and look and feel of the place. We're going to show you what it's going to look like. We have samples of all the different finishes to show around.
 - b. Shamus: I work in campus facilities for 3 years now in October. We've been working on this forever and I've been on project since the beginning. The entrance to the student center is in the

post office, directly across from the VC. This is the view of the entrance. It's hard to see this drawing, because architect designed it. Essentially what it will look like. I'm going to go through how we got to where we are. Color scheme derived from Baruch's identity and branding. From that, we went for a gray pallet. This is the floor plan of the space. If you guys follow along with the arrow, you enter from the elevator this entrance to the corner. This is the lounge area. There will be a lot of soft seating to relax and work. Leads to the main area. We have different tables in the center and bars, which are also able to move for events. You can bring different tables and orient it, but this is the main day to day use, get some tables and chairs that has the same information. Set along the side for soft seating. Break out rooms, conference room, and instead of large tables, we did briefing tables for underneath. If you need to do a different type of event, different arrangements. This breaks down some of the furniture. The bathrooms are beautiful. We have high bar stools in the corner and standard chair height over here. This is some of the soft seating. The fabric is really interesting and inspired from 2 assistants in my office. Style for her work is messy, so it's incorrect but correct. That's what a bunch of these faces are essentially. To contrast the faces, we went for a triangular fabric. Here's the view from one of the areas. This is as you walk down the stairs down the elevators, you see the different types of seating. There's this staircase called the rise. 1 tiered, 2 or 3. Different orientations. Then we have these other round tables throughout the space. Soft seating. Little more casual. Another view looking towards the front. The soft seating is all along here. Same with this set up over here. Bar height, which is movable for the bar stools that can be moved for events. When I talk about interior design, I just don't stop. I know how limited space is, so this is going to be a great getaway. From seeing previous, all fabrics are very durable. You can eat here with your friends, multi-use and multifunction.

- c. Joshua: For all the seating, how much of it is powered? Is there internet connection?
- d. Shamus: All the seats along the wall are powered. The only thing not powered are tables in the center. Due to contract, we're not allowed to drill through the floor.
- e. Taji: You mentioned this is the basement, you said the first floor is 1000 feet. What's there?
- f. Shamus: That's the entry.
- g. Katherine: Entrance and security officer.
- h. Basil: What is the max capacity and is this recreational as in no classes?
- i. Shamus: To my knowledge, there will be no classes.
- j. Damali: We want it to be for club use, but we did a poll and nobody wanted that except for the students in club life. Now, there's no club events, we'll do programming, but not club programming. 150 students at a time. Our office is managing the space, so we'll be working on some kind of system to have students come in and out.
- k. Briana: Will this be open 24 hours during finals?
- 1. Damali: As of right now, no. Open until 10pm.
- m. Roshen: One of the pictures, the tables near the soft benches. Are those tables you can move around the entire space?
- n. Shamus: Yes. Just make sure no one takes them.
- o. Robert: You mentioned for recreational usage, but can clubs host something in this space or not going to be open for club events?
- p. Damali: Students are clear about having a non-club space. We don't want to open that up.
- q. Joshua: Whenever club events do happen here, there's a population of students that are concerned about not having a place to sit, chill, and study or get work done.
- r. Denise: I think I notice earlier that there would be office desks. Is there small mini offices in the space?
- s. Damali: We'll need professional staff member there from student life.

- t. Dean: There are also 2 other offices as conference rooms.
- u. Genesis: Will there be vending machines and microwaves?
- v. Shamus: There are vending machines in the corner. Microwaves...?
- w. Damali: USG usually pays for microwaves.
- x. Katherine: We should really think about that. We do have microwaves in the dining area. We're going to have vending machines, which is great. We do have differently places that have a real focus on dining, but I leave this to student life. Is this an area we want it to be dining? You're going to see just how the concept of this has changed based on what students were asking, I think we're going to see how it's used and what the students needs are. I know I find that I love to eat, however, when I'm in a subway car and someone opens their take out food in a confine space... that's me though. Students are gonna see it and use it and figure out what they want.
- y. Mohtisham: When will it be open by?
- z. Katherine: Anticipated opening in the spring 2020. Generations before you have been involved in advocating for this space.
- ** Dakshatha arrives 5:51PM **
 - aa. Genesis: Being a part of Robert's committee, I was told we were possible going on a tour to prepare for the opening ceremony. When would the date be?
 - bb. Damali: We'll get back to you. When it's safe.
 - cc. Shumas: It's still a hard hat area.
 - dd. Dean: Lots of students before you paid it forward came forward to the administration and got people involved. Lots of people sat at the table, advocated, and paid it forward and they have a lot to say and questions and labor went into this. I'm excited this is going to be a reality. Unfortunately, I hope that you guys take advantage of that.
 - ee. Yam-Yu: This space, will it be available to only Baruch students?
 - ff. Katherine: Yes, you paid for it.
 - gg. Emmanuel: Would it be available 7 days a week?
 - hh. Katherine: 5 days from 8am-10pm.
 - ii. Damali: Currently, the operating costs come out of student activity fee. You want more hours? We need more activity fee.
 - jj. Nicole: How would we go about putting more money into the activity fee?
 - kk. Damali: It would have to go on through a referendum. As long as the campus isn't closed, it will be open. I want to give credit where credit is due. We had a lot of false starts in terms of looking for property. Katherine Cobb was a woman with a mission. She kept going into the post office, this is the first partnership with post office of this type. She literally stalked them. Cobb put a lot of footwork into this.
 - ll. Katherine: I'm so excited to see this finally happen. This is going to be awesome.
 - mm. Joshua: Us, too.
 - nn. Katherine: Who knows, maybe if we get additional funding and good tenants in the post offices, maybe we can come up with a plan.
 - 2. James Neimeister | Census Corp
 - a. James: I work with NYC Census 2020. It's the city's campaign to retrieve full and accurate count for the 2020 census. This census is going to be one of the big civil rights issues for next year. It's used to allocate funding for programs like housing vouchers, food stamps and so many other things that New Yorkers depend on. It's going to be key to redistricting, so NYC may lose seats in the House of Reps if we don't get an accurate count.

b. James: To put this into perspective for you, for the 2020 Census, NYC self response rate was more than 10, almost 15% less than the rest of the country on average. 62% filled it out and mailed it back on their own in comparison to 76% across the country. To give a little bit of perspective on why, New York has the hardest to account communities in the country. That includes immigrants, immigrant non-English proficient language speakers, children are very often undercounted, renters, communities with any amount of distrust towards the government.

- c. James: You name it, we pretty much have it in NYC. And of course the administration plan to add the citizenship question has further thrown a wrench into all this. For the first time it will be online. Most of them will not get it in the mail. It will also be the first census where you can fill it out on the phone and offered in different languages. If you have questions about that, I'm happy to talk more about it. We have 3 asks for you. 1 is to sign up to volunteer with the city's campaign. You want to know more, you can fill these out. If I can pass these around. Apply to CUNY census core jobs. The deadline is this Thursday. I'm also an MBA student here. That's 2 things. We want you to volunteer. We want you to apply. And I want you to talk to me about how to connect with your student groups.
- d. Genesis: On the website, the deadline has been extended Sunday, 5PM.
- e. Annmarie: What's the application process like for CUNY Core jobs?
- f. James: I tried to fill it out myself. Short cover letter. Resume. Expect that.
- g. Kim: Do you have any flyers to email or post around? I'll email you.
- h. Denise: Here is says NYC census but also says US census. If you sign this, is this for New York one?
- i. James: To be clear, I work for the NYC local government, we're not necessarily connected to federal government, we talk to them. This is for local government.
- j. Kim: What methods are the best to talk to people who have distrust in the government with everything happening with immigration? How do you approach that?
- k. James: We're looking for volunteers who have authentic connections in their community. What we know, having a 1-on-1 conversation with your neighbors about why it's important to be involved, voting or filling out this form, that's what actually moves people. We like to say it's 10 questions, it takes you 10 minutes, and it affects the next 10 years.
- 1. Kim: Can you leave the forms with us to have people sign up?
- m. James: I can give you a bunch of these cards.

3. Nominations

- a. Chair of Philanthropy
 - i. Joshua: Motion to elect Genesis to be Chair of Philanthropy.
 - ii. Briana: So moved.
 - iii. Irine: Seconded.
 - iv. Genesis Calle: I'm honored to be nominated. Becoming a member of the philanthropy was how I got involved in USG last year. To be chair of it and to show Baruch and the public that USG not only cares about its students, but also the people and general wellness for all is vital and makes society in all of us so thank you for the nomination.
 - v. Kim: What are some initiatives you've been brainstorming?

- vi. Genesis: I would like to do more food drives, school supply drive, coat drives. Also looking into other creative ways to raise money for charities. Pie event would be nice to do again, but we would be open to more creative and fun ways for people to come and donate to charities.
- vii. Kim: My vice chair just planned a food drive, work on it, it's for Christmas with Richard.
- viii. Aaron: Just one point I thought about before that I brought up last year, if you plan on large scale events, make sure you're not spending more than you're actually making.
- ix. Genesis: I read through all of it.
 - 1. Motion passes. 17-0-0.
- 4. Gigi Kaur | Chair of Appeals
 - a. PSA Pakistani Professional Panel
 - Gigi: They're appealing for their event Pakistani Professional Panel. In their budget already, they have \$75 in refreshments, \$10 in supplies. They're requesting \$170 in refreshments and \$50 in supplies and \$350 in miscellaneous. Motion to allocate \$570 to the budget of PSA's Pakistani Professional Panel.
 - ii. Parmeet: It's our second semester back as our club has restarted. It stopped being in function in 2017. We're trying to separate ourselves from other cultural clubs by hosting professional events. We've hosted two GIMs and our biggest event is tomorrow night in the MPR. We've seen excellent attendance. I'm a finance major and have done a lot of internships and met different professional throughout my 3.5 years at Baruch. Some are Baruch alum and some are not. I want to give them to come back. We already made contact with a lot of people working at the biggest banks and accounting firms. We want to give them a chance to come here. As Baruch has biggest international student body. 3 of the others are Baruch alumni who graduated this year, last year, or from 2017. It's a good mix.
 - iii. Mohtisham: I feel this event is important to Baruch students. We have experienced people as well as alumni from Baruch. You allocated \$100 less. As our club just came back alive, we've been having growing membership. We request full budget to be allocated to give the people what they want and expect.

- iv. ???: Especially because we're bringing in people outside of Baruch. A good impression left on them will persuade them to come back. This event is not just Pakistan people. We expect a large crowd in December.
- v. Gigi: I gave you the full allocation. I met with Aroosh (?) and this was the amount we agreed on and they sent me the budget appeal form back in October and those amounts were reflected and requested.
- vi. ???: We were reorganizing and replanning the events that we planned in the past. We do need more excess in supplies and things we did not allocate before such as treats for professionals. These things were not accounted for before. We're trying to fine-tune our event to appeal to these professionals.
- vii. Kim: Do you have an estimate about the amount of people?
- viii. ???: We've been having a lot of people at our GIM and about 300 for tomorrow night. As the only Pakistani club in the CUNY network, a lot of other CUNY schools want to

attend, but we are not opening it up because of the limited space. We're expecting about 100+ in the professional panel.

- ix. Tam: Can you give us a timeline? It seems like you handed in two different breakdowns. She said she met with one of your E-Board previously.
- x. Gigi: It was recent.
- xi. Tam: If you want to make a case to increase to \$675, you can right here, but there are other ways to increase.
- xii. ???: We don't want to leave any stone unturned to make sure the night goes as effectively as we planned.

- xiii. Aaron: Personally, I just think it's unfair to us as well as to Gigi where she did the work and met with your E-Board and gave you the full allocation that was originally proposed, and then without her knowledge, coming asking for more even though she allocated what you originally asked for. It's unfair to increase it more on short notice.
- xiv. ???: We apologize for that, but a point to remember is we've never hosted an event before. We planned supplies and other numbers over time. For a lot of us, it's our first semester of PSA. We understand that it is unfair to you guys to ask for a higher amount last minute, but we would appreciate it taking into account this is us starting up, and going forward, you can be confident that substitutions will not arise.
- xv. Mohtisham: When we were making this, we had more people attend the first GIM than expected. We see that club is getting more popular day by day. Our expectations have been override from students who want more from PSA, so I understand it's our fault, but we hope you'll understand our situation and allocate all the funds.
- xvi. Syed: From a business standpoint, we should have done our due diligence before. Our sincere apologies for that. However, allocating this money is not a grant, it's an investment. We just came back and built up clout for the semester and having our first big event tomorrow night. This first impressions are everlasting. If we can make it an annual event, that would be great. We hope you can look at this as an investment and that sort of appeals to you.
- xvii. ???: This is more of a cultural event that doesn't have games. We would not have argued so much for a small amount of funds.
- xviii. Annmarie: As a worst-case scenario, you could always ask USG to cosponsor for the additional amount that you need.

- xix. ???: If the process is a hassle and unfair, we're fine with the \$655 we're getting right now and using that method to get that additional money in cosponsorship.
- xx. Dakshatha: It's not that the process is a hassle. Usually in this situation, if the club is not happy with their allocation, they let Gigi know and they work with you to make sure your allocation fits to your expectations or you can bring it to the senate table and the table can decide. It's only in the interest of time because of the late notice. It's not the \$24 we're fighting about, we're talking about the process.
- xxi. Aaron: I'm confused about the \$24. How much are you looking for now?
- xxii. Basil: You had these big GIMs, do you have rough numbers of guest? And what would the miscellaneous \$350 go towards?

xxiii. Mohtisham: First GIM, we expected 30-40. We had 80 people. Second GIM, same turn out. Expecting 300-400 people for tomorrow night. People will come and go.

	encourage students to participate more.

- xxv. Irine: I saw that on miscellaneous, you had Q and A winner, how does that work?
- xxvi. ???: At the beginning of the event, it's more for trivia, Q and A with the students, from finance and accounting. Ask industry specific and whoever 4 students answer gets the 4 amazon gift cards.
- xxvii. Mohtisham: Different students would win throughout the event.
- xxviii. Denise: You also have the option to ask for cosponsorship money, it gives you the chance to ask for more money outside of appeals.

- xxix. Motion passes. 15-1-1.
- b. VSA Paris By Night
 - Gigi: They're allocating for Paris By Night. This is their 7th year having their event.
 \$1,600 in refreshments, \$350 in supplies, \$1,300 in contracts, \$50 in miscellaneous. They're requesting \$5,000 in contracts and \$150 in miscellaneous. I decided to allocate
 \$4,500 in contracts and \$50 in miscellaneous. The numbers were not finalized for the 3 performers, so we went off estimate around \$4,500. \$50 for miscellaneous. They're not completely sure what they're going to buy. They know 2 gift cards, \$50. When they know the rest, that will probably go through with Denise. Motion to allocate \$4,550 to VSA's Paris By Night.
 - ii. Tyler: This is the 7th year. It's dinner with entertainment sit down. Paris By Night is based on a variety show with the same name. It was created by a Vietnamese who fled to Paris. Throughout the years, different segments, traditional wear fashion show, singing performances, dance performances, inside and outside of Baruch. Big part of event, they'll be our highlight and headliners. That's a big part of why the contracts are so high. A lot for the performance fees. We had emailed them and found out what they were charging, but what was unclear was their travel and housing that they're still unable to book yet. Book within the next two days. Like Gigi said, we're able to narrow down numbers a little bit. We think it'll give enough leeway. For miscellaneous, we also do giveaways. We know for sure, 2 \$25 Amazon gift cards. The other 2 big prizes that we give away are a mini projector and Nintendo switch. We already have \$300 coming in from USG event, Halloween Art contest. If there's anything else we don't have enough to cover for, we're willing to go to Denise.
 - iii. Kim: How much in prior year this event has cost?
 - iv. Tyler: I do have some records, I would have to look through.

- v. Gigi: There is an increase from last time. Last year, they had connections with performers, so friends would perform for cheaper or free. This year, they don't have the luxury of those connections.
- vi. Tyler: In the past years, we were able to make a lot more deals. A lot of negotiations. We look back through our budget, we see an increase each year we do it. We try to beat last year with different or more performers. This year, we don't have the same circumstances.
- vii. Annmarie: Who are the performers?
- viii. Gigi: It's in the appeals file.
- ix. Tyler: Nhi Nguyen, JR Aquino, Andrew Garcia.
 - 1. Motion passes. 15-2-0.
- c. WIB Style Your Success
 - i. Gigi: This is the 11th year. Tickets are going to charity. 150 cap because of walkway. Currently in their budget, they have \$2,000 in refreshments, \$720 in supplies, \$350 in contracts, and \$500 in miscellaneous. They're requesting \$580 in supplies and \$650 in contracts. Contracts are for DJ, lighting guy, and asking a friend to do make up for the models. I decided to allocate \$180 in supplies. Based on past events other clubs have done, I see they can decorate the MPR with much less. The most I appealed for is \$300. I think they can do the same. If they find cheaper options, I believe they can bring it down to \$900. Motion to allocate \$830 to WIB's Style Your Success Fashion Show.
 - ii. Siri: This is our award winning show. More than 150 people attend. Purposes of it is to expose students to different types of fashion. Professional day to night. The charity experience partnered with breast cancer society. We have record amount of people working this year. All members to come to the event, we have increased expectations. Because this is a grand event, we expect all members to attend this event.
 - iii. Kelsey: We do have over 60 members currently active and more people coming in and out. SYS in the past, we had 114 stressed donations. Year before that, 2017, 199 tickets on record.
 - iv. Siri: Tickets are suggested donations to come in. This event is mandatory for everybody in WIB.
 - v. Kelsey: 60 active members, 101 registered as going.
 - Daniela: We do have a lot of more people in showing interest all pursuing induction. We vi. like to see more people joining. Thank you, Gigi, for allocating full amount in contracts for lighting and make up artist. For supplies, I'm worried. From previous records, my projections are from last years. Last year, we appealed \$1000. We spent \$1,589 for supplies. We're asking to allocating for \$580, so we're being more moderate in spending, but also consider our theme: concrete jungle. It's New York with a lot of safari themed items and animal aspects. Those are very item specifics and cost much more. Specifically, animal masks. They're item specific. We want models to walk down in them. SYS is about ideas and bringing ideas to life. It's specific and hard to find cheaper alternatives. Usually, we're working with Amazon because it's student friendly, free 2 day shipping and compared prices for best option. This is an example. This is 1 mask and was \$10.68. We did check Dollar Tree. They didn't have animal mask we wanted. We researched 12 pieces for \$12.99. We have been looking for cheaper alternatives to make our event successful. Total \$900 will fall short. So I would like to ask for \$280 to have the even \$1,000. That's less than last year, we're trying to be more moderate in our spending. This is our largest event for the fall semester.

- vii. Basil: Gigi, can you talk about how cheaper options could happen, they have a good argument about the cost of their items.
- viii. Gigi: Current lights would cost them around \$140. I know a lot of clubs have asked for lights from other clubs and from USG. We can all share and save money. The backdrop for the brick wall costs \$70. I did some research and found one for \$15.
- ix. Daniela: I'd like for you to click on the link for the backdrop. It's specific, that's why we chose that one. Concrete jungle aesthetic. There were other options as well, but SYS committee has a vision. When we see something and we like it, we like to do whatever we can to accomplish that. This is something that you can only see at the screen, but at the event, will be much greater than you anticipated. Imagine this, but we also have an option to spray paint it and be interactive as well. It's about the overall effect.
- x. Siri: It's about the experience and have the option to paint. We have a committee of 10 people have been working on this for months. They've done their research and tried to make the best options as possible. We're trying our hardest to be conservative with how we're doing things.
- xi. Tam: Since you are very innovative individuals, going with Gigi's options is not bad at all. If you're going to spray paint it as well anyway, it's a chance to be more artistic. I'm not that convinced that you should buy a pre-set backdrop.

- xii. Daniela: Having the brick theme was the whole concrete jungle. I totally see your point about being artistic and doing it ourselves. It's also about time. We all have midterms and exams, but that's not an excuse. But yeah, we'll definitely consider it.
- xiii. Damali: I caution you guys about how you question all clubs. If there are other clubs you didn't get into details of their choice in color of paper plates, I say you decide a certain amount. It's not necessary of USG to dictate the vision of an event.
- xiv. Briana: Would you be open to cosponsorship?
- xv. Daniela: We had mixed feelings about it. This is the largest event for this semester. We want it to be whole WIB contribution rather than having outside clubs due that, but if it does become an issue where we can not get clubs to get the full amount, it would have to be another option we have to take. We would love to just do it all on our own.
- xvi. Siri: We're in connection with various other clubs, so it's an option we're willing to consider.
- xvii. Denise: You can cosponsor with USG. I believe WIB has cosponsored with USG for the same event in the previous years. That is also an option that you have.
- xviii. Daniela: We had spoke about it and come to terms with \$280. About 20 minutes before the meeting started, we got a message it would actually be \$180 for a grand total of \$900 under supplies. Asking for this \$280 as originally planned seems fair to me.
- xix. Gigi: Yesterday, I did tell you \$280. Today, I spend the entire day going through allocations and searching through your expenditures and I found that the price can be decreased a lot more than what I originally thought. So before the meeting, I let you know it can go down to \$180 and you can still have your event just how you want it.
- xx. Taji: We were talking before about PSA about doing something short notice. If we did say \$280, I feel we should give them \$280. It's last notice to tell them \$180.

- xxi. Taji: Motion to allocate \$280 in supplies and \$650 in contractions totaling \$930 WIB's Style Your Success Fashion Show.
 - 1. Motion passes. 10-5-2.
- d. ASAB Taste of Africa
 - Gigi: This is their 10th year having it. They have \$20 in supplies and \$3000 in contracts. They're requesting \$500 in refreshments, \$3,392.42 in contracts, and \$84.16 in miscellaneous. Motion to allocate \$3,976.58 to ASAB's Taste of Africa.
 - ii. ??: This year is our 10th annual fashion show. It's a platform to give you insight on different African cultures with performances, dances, and basically to get rid of misconceptions in African cultures.
 - iii. Peter: Our show is to show the Baruch community about African cultures because there are a lot of misconceptions. They think it's lions and safaris. There are bustling cities. We have culture there as well. It's a way to give the Baruch community and other CUNY's a taste of Africa. We have performers, DJ's, dancers, fashion designers, they're a major part of the show.
 - iv. ??: It's not excluded to anyone. The host we have is able to interact with the crowd. Just because you're not African does mean he'll make you feel weird or anything like that.
 - v. Andres: Who's the host?
 - vi. ??: Young Prince, famous host with other CUNYs.
 - vii. Peter: One of the premier hosts, especially in the African community. We also have a line of different designers. DJ. We'll also planning on having videography and photography provided. That's a major part of our budget allocation. \$1000 for both videography and photography. They've been doing it for years. You get a package in 4k. We want to document this 10th year in. It's major for us.
 - viii. ??: Last year was the first time we sold out of all tickets, but there was no documented video of the show.
 - ix. Peter: We were trying to figure out where to put people. The event was sold out. I told some people you're supposed to buy two weeks ago and you didn't. We would like to improve on it this year.
 - x. Basil: 2 questions. What have you spent historically? Do you have to buy tickets to attend?
 - xi. Peter: The way the show has worked in previous years, we sell ticket to enter the show. The prices are \$5 for Baruch and \$7 at the door for outside students. The revenue from tickets don't come back to us. Other culture clubs that throw shows in Mason Hall also have to sell tickets to pay for Mason Hall as well. Last year, it cost us \$2,027.44 for Mason Hall. We do get the Hall, but we have to pay for lighting and sound, another \$1,265. Off the bat, over \$3000 in contractuals just for Mason Hall.
 - xii. Kim: Where does the money go?
 - xiii. Damali: Whenever ticket sales are sold, the money goes back to USG surplus. Clubs don't keep the money. Any shows with fixed ticket price, money goes back to USG.

 - xiv. Gigi: Usually in the best, they always cosponsor for refreshments. That was the advice they were given from last year's chair of appeal. After meeting, we decided it's best to add it to the appeal so it's better for their budget years coming into the future.
