## Reports

- 1. Gigi Kaur | Chair of Appeals
  - a. USA Jaggo Night
    - Gigi: This is their annual event. They have it every year in the spring. In their budget, they currently have \$1,000 in refreshments, \$200 in supplies, \$38 in equipment, \$600 in contract, and \$57 in miscellaneous, totaling \$1,895. They're requesting \$1,395.55 in refreshments, \$902.96 in supplies, \$368.32 in equipment, and \$400 in contracts. I decided to allocate \$1,095 in refreshments, \$600 in supplies, \$250 in equipment, and \$400 in contracts. This would bring them to a total of \$2,345. Motion to allocate \$2,345 to USA's Jaggo Night.
    - ii. Andres: Seconded.
    - iii. Tres: We're very grateful for the funds, but we think to have a successful event, we'll need more.

- iv. Sunjit: Jaggo Night is a tradition that occurs the night before Panjabi wedding. Both paternal sides of the bride and groom get together and go throughout the village, sing, dance with a jaggo, which is this clay urn that has lamps on it to wake up everyone in the village to let everyone know they're getting married and invitations.
- v. Tandeep: We implement this by choosing one side because typically the groom and bride can't spend the night before the wedding together and they celebrate the last night with their families. We allocate relatives within our club so we have representation and we bring in the clay pot with the lights on it. We go around our event and explain what a jaggo is and what the tradition means to us. This event is important for us as a club. It's one of our main events for club members. It's been an important event in the Bearcat community. It's even received a Bernie award last year. We would appreciate it if you helped us out.
- vi. Robert: Can you go in-depth why you allocated the way you did? Is this what they asked for?
- vii. Gigi: I based it off of their fall semester event, Bengala Bash. It was the same amount of attendance and relatively the same audience. The refreshments were too high for what we gave from last year.

- viii. Gigi: Going to these events myself and looking at the menus and the options, I've noticed there's a lot of food leftover or there's too much variety that is not needed. I thought this could be an allocation they can work with and still have a great event.
- ix. Marvin: Is this amount enough for you to work with or do you want more?
- x. Tandeep: Although we're grateful, we would like to ask for more, especially for food.
   Although Bengala Bash did have food for 500 people, there were not 500 people at the event. There were definitely less because it was more towards the end of the semester.
   And yet, we only had half a tray of food left. Jaggo Night, we're expecting a bigger audience and think that we would need more money for food and beverages.
- xi. Robert: How much more would you want if you were to get more money?
- xii. Tandeep: About \$100 to \$150 more. This amount is sufficient for the menu itself, but this wouldn't include beverages.
- xiii. Joshua: Gigi, were you aware of that going into the appeal process?
- xiv. Gigi: It was a part of the break down they sent me.
- xv. Dakshatha: What was the reason the \$100 was allocated?
- xvi. Gigi: I didn't know they wanted another \$100. Based on the amount allocated over here. This was for 500 people.
  - 1. Motion fails, 2-16-1.
- Taji: Motion to allocate \$100 additional to refreshment, totaling \$1,195 in refreshments,
   \$600 in supplies, \$250 in equipment, and \$400 in contracts, totaling \$2,445 to USA's
   Jaggo Night.
  - 1. Motion passes, 17-0-2.
- 2. Tam Phuong | Treasurer
  - a. Tam: We talked about this during our winter meeting, but I'm readdressing this for official records. This is the Fall 2019 expenditures. We reached the goal to spend at least half our budget, but the problem is, it's not spent in equal parts.
    - i. Community Development Relation Breakdown

- 1. Tam: I categories events as I see fit. This is for anything that builds the Baruch community. Welcome Week events, Homecoming, any of Tony's events.
  - a. Contracts: used 75.92%
    - i. Tam: This is for performers or services.
  - b. Refreshments: used 79.76%
    - i. Tam: This is food or drinks.
    - Supplies: used 35.50%
      - i. Tam: This is 1-time use supplies.
  - d. Equipment: No money allocated
    - i. Tam: Any long term use equipment. Example, a fan.

    - i. Tam: This is anything that can't be categorized into the other four, like t-shirts.

      - i. Tam: I used most of the budget for Breakfast at Bernies.
    - c. Supplies: used 4.48%
    - d. Equipment: No money allocated
    - e. Miscellaneous: used 40.64%
      - i. Tam: We still have money for giveaways for finals week.
    - f. Total: used 41.53%
  - 2. Tam: Most of our giveaways are quite costly. Keep that in mind.

- vii. Tam: Key takeaways are slow down on refreshments. Contracts will be used as we have planned ahead. Supplies we have money to spend or I can line change to cover up expenditures. Miscellaneous, surprisingly, we have used over half of it. We'll have to see if we have to move money.
- viii. Operating Budget
  - 1. Tam: Usually you guys don't touch this. Top 4 operates from this side. Senate meetings, retreats, USG hangouts, lawyers. This amount will change soon by the next time I report it. I expect it'll be 40% or 45% next time I report.

- b. Yam-Yu: When is the next time you report?
- c. Tam: Next month. Maybe March.

- d. Kim: Most of the money I spend is on food because that motivates people. Can we move from merch to food?
- e. Tam: It's possible, but we're going to be strict on the money. I need you guys to be on time with breakdowns with events 2-3 weeks ahead. Tony and Briana have been great with it so far. If you give me the breakdown ahead and it's justifiable, I'll be able to help with the expenses.
- 3. Tony Chen | VP of Student Affairs
  - a. Tony: Today, we have the Wowfull event. The survey is on the USG Table drive on the first page. In the first 30 minutes, we collected about 150 responses and about 230 responses. Next feedback, maybe we can ask some questions. Some students are just putting a period to skip some questions. If you're free, try to come and monitor people who fill out the survey. Club fair, we ordered these journals for people who fill out the survey. At the club fair, have your committee members talk about their job roles. Maybe have your vice chairs and talk to the students. There's a value to giving out the giveaways. Battle of Lex. We have someone to be the Bearcat. That's set. Bearcats on Ice, we're thinking about giving tickets away during club hours starting February 13th. If a student can't come to Bearcats on Ice, they can give the ticket to someone but they must be Baruch students. If you're free that night, try to go to the center at 5 PM.
  - b. Taji: Was the survey anonymous?
  - c. Tony: We have their name and email.
  - d. Dakshatha: Battle of Lex is next week February 6th, 5 PM. I hope everyone shows up. Wear the most amount of Baruch you can think of. Wear USG jackets. Food. Hanging out. Bring your Bearcat spirit against rival Hunter. There are two games. Women's game and men's game.
  - e. Nicole: There's food at this event?
  - f. Damali: In the Aux Gym.
  - g. Andres: Are outside guests allowed for Battle of Lex?
  - h. Savanna: Yes. It's open. No guest list. Show ID to get in.
  - i. Yaseen: It can be anyone?
  - j. Damali: Yes. I want you to match my spirit.
  - k. Emmanuel: Are there any planned halftime shows or performances?
  - 1. Tony: We might have a shooting contest. \* Basketball \* shooting contest.
  - m. Tony: It's a very short half time, so we might not get half a performance from the club. Also for Battle of Lex, we're giving away headbands for people who wear something with the bearcat or has Baruch on it. If we don't get them on time, they can just write down their name and pick it up another day.
  - n. Sandy: For the survey, are you planning on sharing results?
  - o. Marvin: We'll talk about it afterwards.
  - p. Tony: For valentine, instead of the matching thing, I talked with Joshua, Damali, and Savanna, and we said it's better if we did something like a battle of the couples. If you have a couple at the school who would be interested, have them fill out the form.
  - q. Emmanuel: Do they have to be a real couple?
  - r. Damali: 2 people. You do not have to be romantically involved?
  - s. Roshen: It's not bad if you are, right?
  - t. Damali: No, it's okay. Battle of the partners. Business partners.
  - u. Joshua: Study buddies.
  - v. Briana: What if we say this is how you ask someone out?
  - w. Joshua: The original idea was similar to that, where you would get someone from the audience and play as tinder and match at the end, but that opens the door for some people feeling entitled and leads to stalking. You don't ever want to entitle someone's time to someone else.

- x. Nicole: I mean...
- y. Joshua: No. No "I mean."
- z. Robert: That's the definition of a relationship.
- aa. Nicole: Are settled on the event name?
- bb. Tony: Heart Beats for Bearcats. Blue Notes will be performing opening and closing.
- 4. Kim Kazdal | VP of Legislative Affairs
  - a. Kim: Just an update. Next Thursday is the big rally. I mean this in the most loving way, but I expect to see all of you there. Let committee members know also that they're expected to be there. I'm eyeing you guys. What's going to happen is we have two political sponsors. Harvey Epstein sponsored the whole thing and pulled some strings. Senator ??? is also coming. We have a few co sponsorships like USS, CUNY Rising, Chi Alpha Epsilon, and ECO club. Encounters and Ticker agreed to cover it. Press coming at 12:30. I think it's going to be very organic. The sponsors are going to speak on the issues and we're going to have the people cosponsoring to also speak on the issues and have students talk for a bit and we'll rally. It's going to be safe and fun. Non-violent. We're going to use our voices and tell our friends. I know members from other CUNY schools will be attending.
  - b. Joshua: Is Free CUNY going to be there?
  - c. Kim: We did reach out and cooperated. As an organization, they will not attend, but members of the organization may attend. They did not decide to cosponsor with us.
  - d. Alfonso: Are we allowed to bring people from other schools? If you want, I can reach out to the higher ed department. I know the project coordinator and reach out.
  - e. Kim: Yes and go for it.
  - f. Damali: For events of this nature, an agenda is best. People get very excited and you don't want anyone to be excluded.
  - g. Nicole: Did you reach out to other professors to talk about it during their class?
  - h. Kim: It's during club hours. PAF Professor Carl Konabush has been helping me. Professor Anna D'Souza and let multiple people be involved with the politics. Maybe we can get them to talk. They're not sponsoring.
  - i. Damali: Is this protest or rally? I just need to know what I'm managing on my side.
  - j. Kim: Only a rally. I think it's going to be a bunch of students who care about an issue gathering together outside of Baruch. With the representatives coming, it'll be awesome to use this as momentum and show we're doing something about it.
  - k. Basil: What do you think is the best way to promote the rise?
  - 1. Kim: Word of mouth. Although marketing is phenomenal, to be honest, I don't know how much of the other communities will be reached. I met a bunch of John Jay kids, sent out the information and let them know to attend. Some of the problems are their club hours don't align with ours. The press is better in the morning. I hope you're all there. I'm coming from an internship, so I'm asking to get off early. I'll need all hands on deck and tell clubs.
  - m. Alfonso: What's the difference between a protest and a rally?
  - n. Damali: Protest means you are against something. Rally means you're trying to get support for something.
  - o. Kim: We were using rally because we thought it was more of a tame word, but essentially we are protesting the state.
  - p. Damali: What's your goal?
  - q. Kim: Our goal is to make noise so when we go up to Albany, we can show we're against the tuition hike and lack of funding from the state.

r. Damali: A protest would be we are not with the current budget. A rally would be these are the areas we want to support, focus on these. That's why I'm asking what is your goal here?

- s. Kim: I think it's a little of both. Make noise and take it into consideration when they're looking at the budget next year.
- t. Damali: I would encourage you, it's fine to make noise, but then what? You want to give people something to support, especially because everyone is super engaged. They want to go to polls and make voices heard. Give people 1 to 2 things to do. People will make noise for anything and then what?
- u. Kim: I was talking to Epstein and he was saying we should draft pledges to sign. It would include reaching out to representatives. We'll give out those pledges during rally and list of representatives and who they can call.
- v. Andres: We come out to protest every single year to no avail. They went from \$200 a year to \$300 without consulting us at all. People have gone to even disrupt the board meetings. They responded very violently with police force. So really, this is all we got. Students don't really have a say, which is why I was so opposed to even having the Chancellor on USG social media in the first place. In terms of these sorts of events and disruptions, that is all we have.
- w. Damali: It's not all that you have. You have a population of voting age young adults that makes noise. What are you telling them to do? It hasn't worked, just making noise. There's a difference between making noise and mobilize. Don't make this just another opportunity to make noise, but to mobilize them. That's a lot more effective. If they can rally this many voters in different districts on multiple campuses, then people are nervous. I would encourage you to mobilize instead of protesting just to protest. They have signs and not know what to do the next day, so what do they do?

- aa. Kim: Can we send out an email this week?
- bb. Denise: Yes.
- cc. Alfonso: I'm sure you can suggest it. I was at City College and we suggested clubs would come because if the tuition goes up, there would be less money for clubs. From my understanding was student activity fee wouldn't change, but the tuition would go up.
- dd. Dakshatha: Would it affect clubs?
- ee. Alfonso: It's not affecting the student activity fee, but is affecting individuals. It's not a club issue. It's a student issue.

- ff. Kim: Alfonso, text me after and I'll give you some jobs to do. So the end of March is going to be census stuff. We're going to have events similar to voter registration, get food and tablets. I want you guys to know the plan. Albany's coming up. It's really connected to the rally. I do want to throw in more run events like the sustainable citizenship events. We shall see. If you have any ideas, let me know. I want to do an immigration panel maybe.
- gg. Marvin: Are we doing anything for the primary to go vote?
- hh. Kim: Yes, but I also want to leave space for the next VP.
- ii. Dakshatha: In terms of why we're focusing on the census, it's important for funding, for colleges, for grants. A lot of things that affect CUNY students specifically. NYC is spending \$40 million to make sure people take the census in light of the comment the president is making about citizenship. We're scared fewer people will fill it out since it'll affect voting districts. Make sure when your household gets it to fill it out. You don't need to be a citizen to fill it out.
- jj. Alfonso: The voting registration deadline got extended to February 14th now. Some messed up voting laws in NY. If you have anyone who needs to get registered.
- kk. Kim: If you come to the rally, it would be great to get people registered to vote. Come to the rally. If you have any questions, let me know.
- 5. Joshua Castillo | EVP
  - a. Joshua: The student center, we don't have a final date, but the window of about March right now. We're working on getting a walkthrough for the people planning the opening ceremony. Hopefully I will have an update in the next coming weeks. In addition, BASH. It'll be happening. We want to get the ball rolling. Something I noticed today with Tony's event. In the beginning, while things were being set up, a lot of people jumped to the front to go get food. About 30 people coming in that were table members, committee members, and weren't committee members. I think that it's up to each chair what their policy is about giving people free stuff, but the fairest thing is if you didn't help with set up or getting anything together for that event, you shouldn't be entitled to free food. That's the fairest way to go about things. There's no reason why such a large amount of people who claim to be in USG jumps in front of the rest of the student population to get free stuff. It's a bad look overall. Spread the word. If you see someone you didn't see helping out, and be a committee member of some sort, be aware of that. Check-ins. New semester, new check-ins. I'll be sending out a document for this week and next week. These will be more goal-oriented, go into solid directions specifically and share that with you. Link up and talk. I'll buy you food if you want.
